Stream Ethics: As gentlemen, we all strive to demonstrate ethical behavior in our fishing. I just returned from a trip to the Salmon River in search of steelhead. While there I could not help but notice a new form of ethics abuse. Yes, I know Spey casting is very popular and it will help you cover a lot of water with more fly on fish time, but there are other things to consider. When the fishing pressure is high and lots of fly fishers looking for a place to fish, Spey casting takes too much room. A good Spey caster can cover an arc diameter of 50 yards or more. That interprets to three Speyers in a 150 yard pool. Whereas, the same pool could hold 10 "Chuck and Duckers".
